

Fire Warden

This course is designed for employees nominated as fire marshals or fire wardens in their workplace. The course design covers both emergency and non-emergency issues of this vital role and equips attendees with an appropriate level of understanding to perform their role safely within their workplace. All of our fire safety courses are instructed by practicing fire service personnel.

Course Duration: ½ Day

Certification: Fire Warden Certificate

Course Outcomes:

At the end of the course each delegate will:

- Have an understanding of The Fire Safety Order; including legislation and fire risk assessment process, plus Fire Policies; their importance and how they impact on you;
- Recognise potential fire hazards and the appropriate actions to eliminate them;
- Understand the dangers of fire and smoke & the importance of regular fire drills;
- Have an understanding of Fire Safety Signs & Symbols, Fire Action Notices & Fire Prevention Signs, plus Means of Escape & associated signage;
- Have an understanding of Emergency Lighting, Fire Alarm Panels, Fire Suppression and Assembly Points;
- Understand the role of Fire Warden including; Raising the Alarm, Liaison with the Fire Service and General Evacuation;
- Understand Human Behaviour; reaction to a fire situation; fight or flight;
- Case Study; serious fire & lessons to be learnt;
- Be able to identify individual classes of fire & select an appropriate extinguisher to tackle, though only if safe to do so.

Pre-requisites:

- None.

Course Accreditation:

- Fire Warden Certificate, which First Rate Training currently validates for 3 years.
